In January 2015, Mr. Paschal was detailed as the TRADOC Acting Deputy, G-3/7 Training, where he is charged with managing and transforming the Army's training base, affecting more than a half million military in over 32 Army schools and training centers. In this capacity, he also manages several major programs including all Army Security Assistance training, Inter-service, and Reserve Component training. Additionally, he serves as the Army's Functional Chief's Representative for over 6,500 Training, Capability, and Doctrine Warfighting Developers serving in Career Program 32.

Mr. Paschal was the Director at the Training Brain Operations Center (TBOC) in Newport News, Virginia. Developed by the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), the Training Brain is the Army's principal enabler for building, validating, creating, maintaining, and delivering the context of the operational environment (OE) for leader development, training and education, capability design, and concept development efforts.

Mr. Paschal retired from the Army as Chief of Operations Group for the Joint Warfighting Center, U.S. Joint Forces Command in Suffolk, Virginia. He was commissioned an Infantry Lieutenant upon completion of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps program at the University of Illinois at Chicago in 1984. He's served in a variety of operational assignments culminating with command of the Warrior Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, for 30 months, including a 15-month tour in Kirkuk, Iraq and is a graduate of the Army's War College at Carlisle Barracks.

Mr. Paschal was born and raised in Chicago, Illinois, and is married with two children. His eldest child, his daughter, is a Special Education teacher and his son serves as a Boatswain's Mate in The United States Coast Guard.
