Standard Operating Procedure for Gear To Go Maintenance of Rental Equipment

1. All Equipment is inspected prior to season of use.
2. The following equipment is inspected and serviced by Gear To Go trained Facility Technicians/Operators.
 - a. Alpine skis
 - b. Trailers
 - c. Boats
 - d. Tents
 - e. Stove and Grills
 - f. Game equipment, Recreation equipment
3. Alpine ski preventive maintenance:
 - a. Gear To Go trained professionals follow the Tyrola Hi-Tech Symrent Procedures
 - b. Attachment A is binder with instructions
 - c. All skis are inspected after each rental return to Gear To Go and serviced before the next rental.
4. Trailers
 - a. Gear To Go has both hardtop and pop up trailers.
 - b. Attachment B is the Maintenance checklist followed by Gear To Go personnel.
5. Boats
 - a. Rental boats include Boston Whalers, canoes, and Kayaks.
 - b. The following inspection is completed for each item prior to rental:
 - Trailer Serviceability – the following items are checked: tires, lights, bearings, and tie downs.
 - Boat Serviceability – the following items are checked – engine (make sure it starts), prop engages to forward, neutral, reverse and returns to a slow idle, engine shuts off by switch with safety lanyard.
 - Each vehicle must have a Coast Guard recommended passenger capacity placard attached, life vests, bailing plug, life ring throw, painter line, distress flag and distress whistle.
6. Tents
 - a. Camping Tents and Party Canopies are available for rental.
 - b. When a tent is returned from rental the following inspection is performed:
 - Check for rips in fabric and serviceability
 - Check for all grommets in place and zippers and other closures are in working order

- Ensure all parts are returned to include poles, stakes, ropes, rain fly, sidewall and instructions
- Ensure item is clean, damage free, and complete

7. Stoves and Grills

- a. Small camping stoves and large outdoor grills are available for rental.
- b. When a grill is returned from rental the following inspection is performed:
 - Item is inspected, ready for service and clean
 - Check gas valves and connections for wear and/or damage
 - Instructions are included

8. Game Equipment and Recreation Equipment

- a. Various non-technical game equipment and recreation equipment are available for rental.
- b. When the equipment is returned the following checks are performed:
 - Check for safety, wear, damage, missing parts
 - Instructions are included for use and game rules

9. The Gear To Go staff performs all general maintenance. If additional technical maintenance or repair is required on any piece of rental equipment it is taken to a local retailer to restore or replace to its proper working condition.
